Human Technology: Investigating the human role in existing and emerging technologies

Continually evolving information and communication technologies (ICTs) touch nearly every aspect of our contemporary life. On the other hand, development of these modern technologies is closely intertwined with human practices and social innovations. The human-technology interaction and the human role in different technologies needs constant investigation, investigation that is highly interdisciplinary and multidisciplinary in its nature. Human Technology is a new, scholarly online journal that provides an outlet for this kind of essential research and scientific discussion.

Human Technology presents innovative, peer-reviewed articles that explore the issues and challenges surrounding the human role in all areas of our ICT-infused societies. The journal seeks to draw research from multiple scientific disciplines with an eye toward how applied technology can affect human existence or how it can, for instance, foster personal development and enhance research and development in industry, education, communication and other fields. Human Technology's dynamic and forward-looking articles are intended for use in both the scientific community and industry and the journal does not set any limits regarding the specialization of its authors. The journal welcomes also difficult or controversial topics, and is interested in publishing non-paradigmatic and non-traditional ideas that meet the criteria for good scientific work.

The semi-annual online journal is offered without charge, underscoring the philosophy that good research must be available to all. Through Human Technology, researchers are encouraged to collaborate on and to explore the

Background

- In line with Agora Center mission:
 - "The Agora Center creatively combines research of high international standards from a variety of scientific disciplines with the know-how derived from its diverse partner network. The Center is based on a shared vision of developing the future knowledge society from a human-centric point of view."
- Need for a high quality distribution channel for interdisciplinary research on human technology (scope & target audience of traditional journals too narrow)
- Dissemination of knowledge and research findings for a wider audience
- Enhancement of interdisciplinary discussion, also outside of academia





JYVÄSKYLÄN YLIOPISTO



- *Human Technology* is a peer-reviewed, scholarly online journal published by the Agora Center/University of Jyväskylä
- Interdisciplinary, multiscientific journal focuses on the issues and challenges surrounding human-technology interaction and the human role in all areas of our ICT-infused societies
- Publishes both thematic issues, with guest editors, and issues based on open submissions
- Semi-annual and online without a subscription or a fee, underscoring the principles of Open Access publishing and the philosophy that good research must be available to all





JYVÄSKYLÄN YLIOPISTO



- First issue published in April 2005
 - Ninth issue to be published this month
 - 44 articles, 13 editorials, and 1 book review
- Readers from all over the world, from every continent
 - Unique visitors 2005 = about 9,240
 - Unique visitors 2008 = about 30,831
 - Unique visitors 2009 (to date) = 10,794 (pre-issue)





JYVÄSKYLÄN YLIOPISTO



- Most popular articles (in PDF) downloaded a few thousand times
- Already being cited around the world and in several languages
- In the first 3 volumes of journal (6 issues), every manuscript but one cited at least once, several 10+, and two 35+ times.
- 1,584 e-notice subscribers, from academia to business entities





JYVÄSKYLÄN YLIOPISTO



- Editorial team:
 - Editor in Chief Professor Pertti Saariluoma
 - Part-time managing editor/copy-editor
 - Part-time technical assistant
- International Editorial Board (with international Association Editors' Board in process)
- Reviewers on an ad hoc basis





JYVÄSKYLÄN YLIOPISTO



- Publication agreement gives *Human Technology* the right to publish, distribute, display and copy the articles
- The author retains the copyright
- The author has the right to republish the article, as long as *Human Technology* is given credit as the first publication
 - Link to Human Technology article preferred
 - Permission expected in advance
- Currently indexed by PsycInfo and DOAJ; Ebsco pending





JYVÄSKYLÄN YLIOPISTO



OA publishing

- OA means readers do not need subscription to access the materials.
 BUT how the work is funded varies: author pays, advertisers pay, organization pays.
- Provides a new opportunities
 - For authors
 - For readers everywhere
- Enhances the free flow of scientific information
 - Truly global reach and audience
 - Less expensive to publish as compared to paper journals
 - Often a quicker means to disseminate research results

Methods of OA publishing

- Independent publishing of research materials
- Publishing via research archive
- Publishing via online journals

(All require access to ISP domain—URL—and ownership of materials)

OA journal publishing issues

Issues with OA journals are similar to those of printed journals:

- What is scope of journal?
- Will it be peer reviewed and, if so, how?
- Organization and process of journal (editorial boards, staffing, etc.)
- Source of manuscripts?
- Publication schedule.
- Issues related to language and editing.
- Funding
- Marketing
- Legal

Benefits OA journal publishing

- Lessons from online publishing:
 - Journal generally easy to find (links etc.), but the importance of search engines and search engine optimization
 - Shorter publication schedules, no typesetting, CAN be quicker turnaround on research results
 - Publication opportunities not available to print journals, e.g. embedded multimedia materials

OA publishing challenges

- New perspective and way of doing things
- Funding
- Reputation, journal rankings and citations
- Reliability and quality (image)
- Having enough ongoing quality submissions
- Permanency (database architecture etc.)

Structural need for good OA journal

- Reputation and networking of EIC and editorial board members
- Good Website
 - Look (visuals)
 - Content
 - Usability
 - Reliability

Structural need for good OA journal

- Workable publications process
 - Who does what and when
 - How one contacts and interacts with referees
 - How one contacts and interacts with authors/guest editors
 - Stable of forms that facilitate process, quality, and continuity of journal's image
- Ongoing stream of timely, interesting, and quality manuscripts
- Accuracy of content and presentation (statistics and editing)
