Sport Federations

- Number of participants, members, competitions
 - 130 sports federations and other national sports organisations (Finland.)
 - There are 7 800 sports clubs in Finland and 89 000 in Germany
 - 1,1 million Finns are members of sports clubs and 27 million members in Germany (one club per 920 persons in Germany and 650 in Finland)
- Comparisons to other continents/countries

Sport structure in Finland

- Governmental level: sport admin
 - In Finland, sporting life is largely based on volunteer activities.
Local authorities provide sports facilities.
 - The Ministry of Education guides sport policy through legislation and financing.
 - Ministry also monitors the implementation of ethical principles in sports, notably anti-doping activities.
- Civil society: organised voluntary & informal sport
 - In Finland 500 000 volunteers, 10 per cent of the population(218 000 women)
 - In Germany 2.1 million volunteers of 10 per cent are ethnic minority and that is 2,6 per cent of the population
- Market: commercial sport

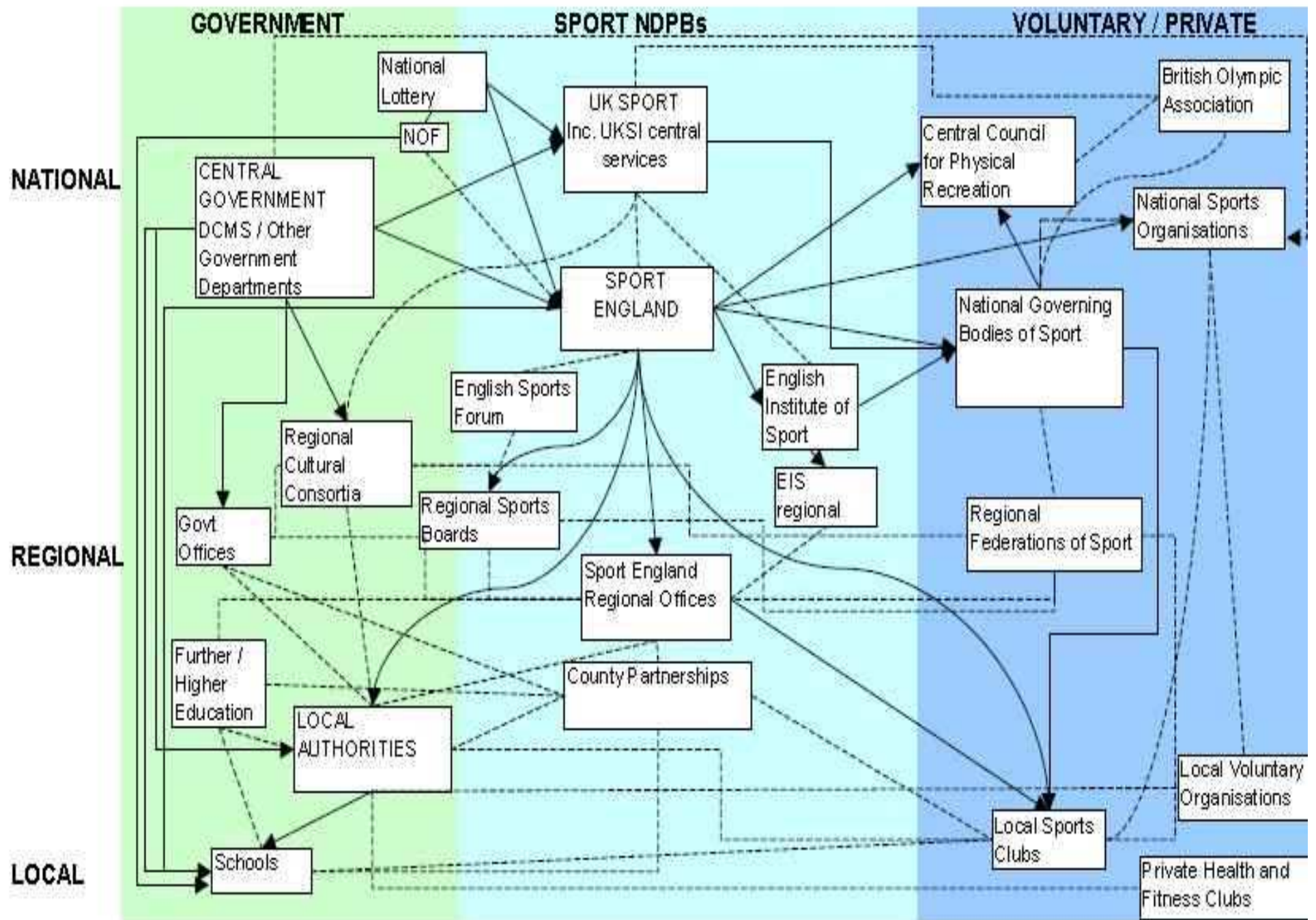
Sport structure in England

- Governmental level: sport admin
